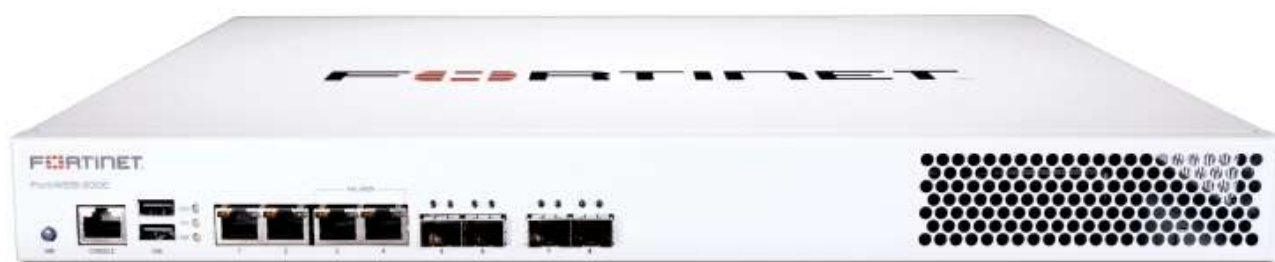

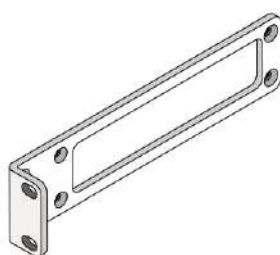

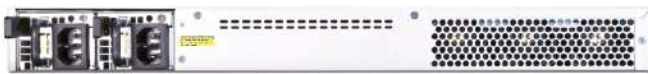

Rear Panel

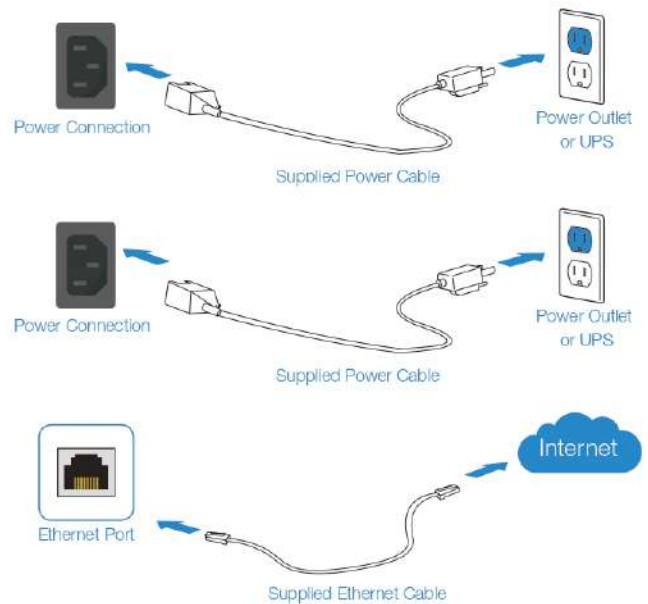

- 1 Power Supply (1+0)** 100-240V AC, 6-3A, 60-50Hz
- **Green:** Power supply operating normally
 - **Flashing Green:** AC detected, operating in standby mode
 - **Red:** Power supply failure
 - **Flashing Red:** AC not detected, secondary PSU operating normally (if installed)
 - **Flashing Red/Green:** Power supply warning event detected
 - **Off:** Power supply is off

Basic Connections

Plug in your device to a power outlet using the provided power cables and connect the Internet to any port using the provided ethernet cable.

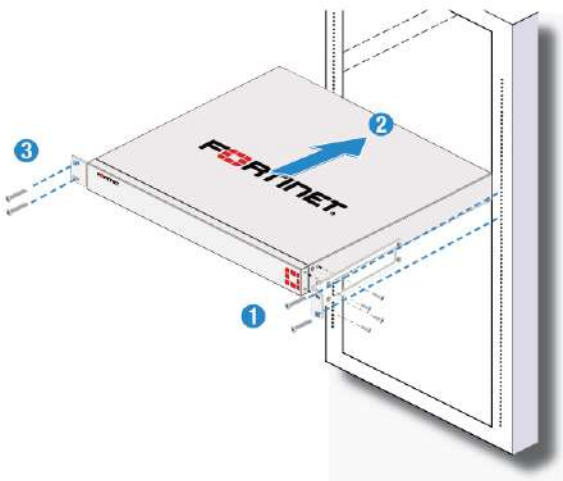


Note: We recommend connecting your device to an uninterruptible power supply (UPS) in case of a power outage

Rack Installation

This device mounts in a standard 19 inch rack.

1. Attach the provided rack-mount brackets and screws
2. Position the device and slide into the rack
3. Fasten the screws to secure the device



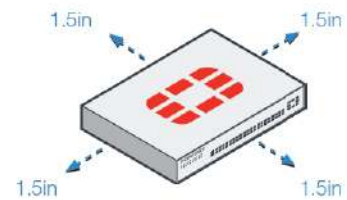
Caution: Ensure there is at least 1.5 inches of space above and below the device.

Warning: For safety, it is recommended that two people install the device

Desktop Installation

You can also install this device as a desktop unit.

1. Place the unit on a flat, clean and stable surface
2. Ensure there is at least 1.5in of clearance for adequate airflow

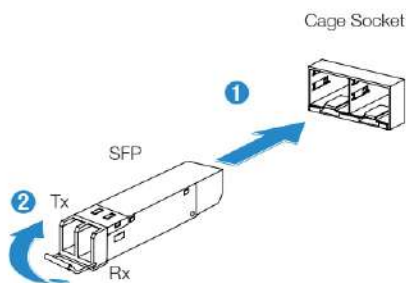


3. Plug in the provided power cables into the rear of the unit and then into a grounded electrical outlet or separate power source

SFP Installation

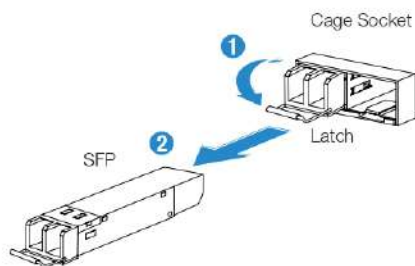
To install the SFP transceivers:

1. Slide the SFP into the cage socket until it clicks into place
2. Lift the latch to lock the SFP



To remove the SFP transceivers:

1. Lower the latch to unlock the SFP
2. Carefully pull the SFP out of the cage socket



Setup Options

Set up your device locally using the GUI or CLI. Choose an option to complete your setup, then configure your device.



A GUI

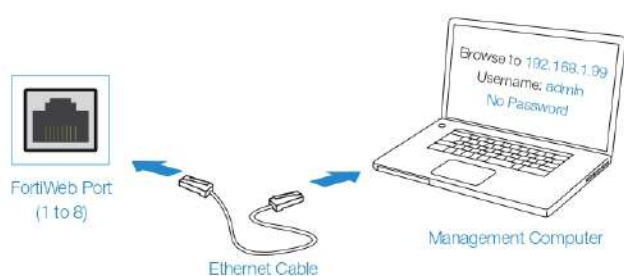
An easy-to-use GUI, compatible with most web browsers. To minimize scrolling, the screen resolution should be at least 1280 x 1024 pixels.



B Command Line Interface (CLI)

An alternate configuration tool from the web-based manager that uses a terminal emulation application to type commands or upload batches of commands from a text file or configuration script.

A GUI



1. Connect a FortiWeb port (1 to 8) to the Management Computer using the supplied Ethernet cable

2. Enable DHCP or set the Management Computer's IP and subnet to:

Static IP Address: 192.168.1.1
Subnet Mask: 255.255.255.0

3. Visit 192.168.1.99 in a web browser

4. Log in with the username admin and no password

5. You can now configure your device

B CLI



1. Connect the Console Port with the Console cable to the USB port on the Management Computer

2. Start a terminal program on the Management Computer and select an available COM Port using the following default settings:

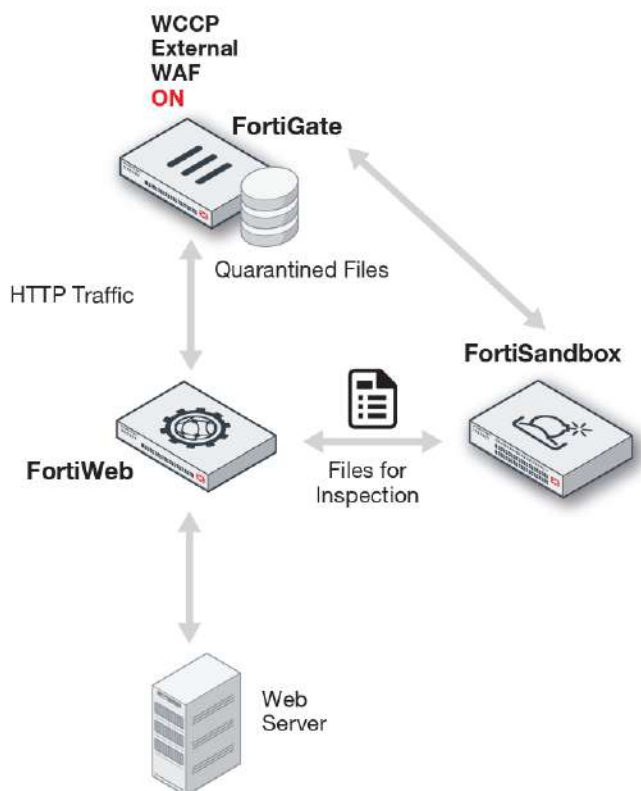
Baud rate: 9600
Data bits: 8
Parity: None
Stop bits: 1
Flow control: None

3. Log in using username admin and no password

4. You can now configure your device
